## ART MATERIALS

Below are two lists: the Essentials\* and the Extras.

### List #1 - The Essentials

JOURNAL & PEN			
<b>ART PAPER</b>  <i>US paper size equivalent:            A4 = letter size            A3 = ledger / tabloid size            A2 = double ledger / tabloid</i>	Ideally <b>smooth mixed-media paper</b> 120gsm - 240gsm*  Suggested size: A3 (or A2 if you want to work big)	*Standard printing paper is 80gsm. For art-making, <b>thicker paper (eg 200gsm)</b> offers strength and durability	e.g. Venus Ultra Sketch A3 drawing pad (20 sheets 200gsm)  e.g. Duria Matt sketching pad (20 sheets 200gsm)
<b>OIL PASTELS</b>	Box of 12 colours	<b>For more colour variety - boxes of 24 &amp; 36 are available</b>	e.g. Pentel, Faber Castell, Staedtler
<b>CHALK / SOFT PASTELS</b>	Box of 12 colours	<b>For more colour variety - boxes of 24 &amp; 36 are available</b>	e.g. Pentel, Faber Castell, Staedtler
	If you enjoy working with chalk pastels you may wish to purchase <b>Fixative</b> to spray over the pastel. <b>Hair Spray</b> also works.		
SCISSORS & GLUE STICK / CRAFT GLUE			
<b>BLACK INK</b>	Black fabric dye or Black fountain pen ink or Black acrylic drawing ink ( <i>note: acrylic ink is quick drying and non-responsive to bleach</i> )		e.g. Dala's Teddy Liquid Dye Parker Quink or Schaeffer bottled ink
<b>TEA &amp; COFFEE</b>	Yes, we paint with these!	Ideally a strong brew of Rooibos (red) tea A strong brew of instant coffee granules	
<b>BLEACH</b>	Yes, this too!	Thin household bleach	
SHOE POLISH OR VASELINE OR COOKING OIL + RAG			
<b>APPLICATORS</b>	Soft paintbrushes / Chopstick or Kebab stick / Feather / Earbud / Old toothbrush		
<b>MAGAZINES (APPROX 3)</b>	Interior / Getaway magazines / National Geographics / Visi etc. Try to avoid fashion magazines.		
<b>COLLAGE PAPERS</b>	Old wrapping paper, tissue paper, recyclable paintings, sweet wrappers, maps etc.

WET COLOUR APPLICATION (PAINTING)	Fabric Dyes <i>(reacts with Bleach)</i>	Powder fabric dye mixed in a small quantity of boiling water	e.g. Lady Dye, Dylon, Dye-It (sold at pharmacies)
	Liquid Dyes <i>(reacts with Bleach)</i>	If buying a limited range, make sure you have black, blue, red, yellow	e.g. Dala Teddy Liquid Dye
	Paints <i>(do not react with Bleach)</i>	Watercolour Acrylic Oil	
	Acrylic drawing ink <i>(does not react with Bleach)</i>		e.g. Dala
DRY COLOUR APPLICATION (DRAWING)	Watercolour Pencils		
	Khokis / fibre-tip pens		
	Thick/chubby wax crayons in Black & White (used for texture rubbings)		
	Charcoal stick for drawing
